

FINNEYTOWN LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT
Community Outreach Forum
William R. Swartzel Performing Arts Center at Finneytown Secondary Campus
March 13, 2018
6:00pm

The Finneytown Board of Education met in special session on Tuesday, March 13, 2018 in the William R. Swartzel Performing Arts Center at Finneytown High School, 8916 Fontainebleau Terrace, Cincinnati, OH 45231. Present were Mrs. Rebman, Mr. Gast, Mr. Engleman and Mr. Stuhlreyer. The president called the meeting to order at 6:05 pm.

23-18 Mr. Stuhlreyer moved, seconded by Mr. Gast, that the Board dispense with approval of the minutes from the regular meeting of February 20, 2018, and the special meeting of March 7, 2018. The president declared the motion passed.

Board President, Mrs. Rebman, introduced Jeff Parker of SHP Leading Design.

Mr. Parker led the community through five master plan options, a final compilation of suggestions, revisions and changes from approximately 25 different community input sessions. Mr. Parker explained the base project cost, local share of the base, proposed locally funded initiatives (LFIs), total local expense, current facility assets preserved, time to construct and annual cost for a \$100,000 home for each option. The presentation was followed by a questions and answers (Q&A) period. Following the Q&A, an electronic voting system was used to determine participant support for each option.

The follow results were collected from the electronic polling process:

- 1) Of the 2 building options, the one most likely supported by Finneytown Voters:
 - a. Option E: 1 vote; 1% of respondents
 - b. Option F: 13 votes; 15% of respondents
 - c. Option H: 75 votes; 84% of respondents
- 2) Of the 1 building options, the one most likely supported by Finneytown Voters:
 - a. Option B: 29 votes; 33% of respondents
 - b. Option G: 59 votes; 67% of respondents
- 3) Comparing G vs. H, the preferred one campus solution versus the preferred two campus solution, the one most likely supported by Finneytown Voters:
 - a. Option G: 51 votes; 57% of respondents
 - b. Option H: 38 votes; 43% of respondents
- 4) Mrs. Noe indicated that absentee votes were received prior to the meeting and will be added to the electronic polling results.

District Superintendent, Mrs. Noe, explained the next steps in the process. Results from the electronic polling and absentee ballot tabulations will be reviewed by the core team and presented to the Board of Education. A recommendation will be presented to the Board of Education for the approval of a final Master Plan for submission to the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) at the March 19, 2018 regular Board of Education meeting. The OFCC master plan submission deadline is March 31, 2018.

24-18 There being no further business, Mr. Engleman moved, seconded by Mr. Gast, that the meeting be adjourned. The president declared the meeting adjourned at 8:07pm.
