

## **FINNEYTOWN LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT**

The Finneytown Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, May 13, 2019 in the Media Center of the Finneytown Secondary Campus, 8916 Fontainebleau Terrace, Cincinnati, OH 45231. Mr. Gast, Mrs. Rebman, Ms. Johnson, Mr. Stuhldreier and Mr. Engleman were present. The Vice President called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

**33-19** Mr. Engleman moved, seconded by Mrs. Rebman, the Board approved the agenda as presented. The President declared the motion passed.

**34-19** Mr. Stuhldreier moved, seconded by Ms. Johnson, the Board approved the minutes from the Regular Meeting of April 15, 2019. The President declared the motion passed.

### **Presentations**

#### **Whitaker Girls on the Run**

Whitaker Students shared information about Girls on the Run (GOTR). GOTR is an international organization serving adolescent girls. Its mission is to inspire girls to be joyful, healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running.

A Finneytown GOTR group meets at Whitaker twice each week. GOTR advisors are Kathy Hall, Jen Bayless and Mechelle More'. GOTR teaches life skills through dynamic, interactive lessons and running games. The curriculum is taught by certified Girls on the Run coaches and includes three parts: understanding ourselves, valuing relationships and teamwork, and understanding how we connect with and shape the world at large.

Running is used to inspire and motivate girls, encourage lifelong health and fitness, and build confidence through accomplishment. Important social, psychological, and physical skills and abilities are developed and reinforced throughout the program. At each season's conclusion, the girls and their running buddies complete a 5K running event which gives them a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals. Finneytown Girls on the Run ran a 5K race on May 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Whitaker Garden Club**

Betsy Thompson, Whitaker Garden Club Advisor, shared information about the Whitaker student Garden Club, which she started in 2016. Each spring, participating students plant, water, fertilize and tend the raised beds in the Whitaker court yard. In 2017, The Whitaker club was adopted by the Civic Garden Center Association, which continues to support the group, donating gardening supplies and equipment. The Garden Club has grown vegetables gardens, butterfly gardens and pollinator gardens. Its pollinator garden is registered with the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden

### **Secondary Campus House System 2019 Update**

Staff and students presented a comprehensive overview of information about the initiatives, activities, events, stories, leadership opportunities, community connections, successes from the past year. This year's theme "Connections with Strangers" was selected in August at a Winton Woods summer retreat involving more than 40 students. Embracement of the theme by the student body has begun to show signs of a real transformation of the culture toward greater kindness, patience, caring and empathy. Referrals for student misbehavior are down from 3001 incidents in 2017-2018 to 1973 so far in 2018-2019. While not the only cause, the House System is being credited as a significant contributor to this improvement in behavior. 2019 house system highlights include: the district's first student talent show competition, serving as host to another House System school from out-of-state school to share experiences, and the awarding of the first House System \$500 student scholarship. The House System endgame is academics. The relationships, meaningful conversations, positive energy, and connections are the foundation for the academic progress that is fully expected to follow.

### **Administrative Report**

**Mrs. Theresa Noe, Superintendent** – discussed the following:

- Attended Whiz Kids Celebration Dinner, Negotiations, VASA and the Business Advisory Council, PTA Educator of the Year (Jen Dinan), Civic Association meeting, Celebrate Excellence Breakfast to honor Lauren Woodward, a Legislative Breakfast, a facilities meeting, and a Bricker and Eckler Construction Methods workshop.
- Worked concessions for a track meet.
- Hosted Finneytown Business Network at the PAC.
- Held interviews for the new Teaching and Learning Coordinator.
- Conducting Exit Interviews for those leaving.
- Coming up, I have a PSW annual review, a recognition dinner at UC Economic Center, HCESC superintendent meeting, NEOLA Social Media seminar, Ethics training at Three Rivers.
- I will be gone to Arizona for my grandson's graduation.
- Last week of school for seniors then the last week for students and staff.
- The leadership team will be going to the Midwest Leadership Summit in West Chester.
- I am part of and will be attending meetings for the VASA advocacy group - we are concentrating on the A-F report card and some alternative solutions.

### **Public Address**

- Emma Tudor, 9<sup>th</sup> grade student, expressed concerns about the proposed change from a 7 bell to a 6 bell schedule for the 2019-20 school year. This is a bad idea. It will hurt hundreds of students taking advance placement courses who in the past were able to take fine arts electives. It will reduce opportunities to learn in career fields of interest and negatively impact college letters of recommendation. The rationale that it will prevent seniors from taking multiple study halls should not outweigh the learning opportunities and career field exposure other students will lose. Thank you.
- Steve Miller, parent, expressed concerns about the proposed change from a 7 bell to a 6 bell schedule for the 2019-20 school year. Most concerned that such a drastic change was made without first having an open discussion with students, parents and taxpayers. Didn't feel like the reasons for the change were explained well or very compelling. Electives previously available on college transcripts for admissions consideration will go away. This is disappointing. The loss of arts education will have a broader impact than we might think. Are we making this change to accommodate the lowest common denominator? The study hall rationale is troubling. Why aren't those kids encouraged to take electives?
- Audrey Kimmach, 9<sup>th</sup> grade student, expressed concerns about proposed change from a 7 bell to a 6 bell schedule for the 2019-20 school year. I found this out only 1 week ago. I am now forced to change my plans and choose between Advanced Chemistry and Chorale, between a subject I need and one I love. This leaves me with a very hard choice. I know many students that do not want bells that are 10 minutes longer. Many students struggle paying attention for 50 minutes. I am often bored in the last 10 minutes of the class length we have now. I find it troublesome to hear this news from another student instead of a counselor or teacher. When questioned, teachers don't seem to know much, or provide information. I have considered open enrollment at Fairfield because they have 7 bells and more options for classes. I am asking the board, superintendent, principals and counselors to reconsider this decision. I am afraid students will move out. The intentions may be good and this decision may benefit teachers, but it does not seem to be in the best interest of the students and takes away from our high school experience.
- Anna Tenhundfeld, 9<sup>th</sup> grade student, expressed concerns about the proposed change from a 7 bell to a 6 bell schedule for the 2019-20 school year. This decision effects my ability to take Chorale, Finneytown's elite, audition music class. Chorale has been a goal that I have worked so hard for the last 5 years. I am a music person; I love music. I want to become a music teacher. Moving from 7 to 6 bells jeopardizes my opportunity to participate in and pursue music as a career. Students are leaving because of this decision. I am taking two advanced classes and an advanced placement class and now won't be able to take Chorale. This will affect our futures. I would definitely like to see Chorale happen next year.

- Tara McMahan, parent, expressed concerns about the cheerleading program at Finneytown. Finneytown is not providing an adequate program in terms of uniforms, facilities, gymnastic mats and gymnastics coaching. These are necessary to compete at this level. Finneytown is not on par with any of the other CHL league schools. Other CHL schools provide cheerleading uniforms. Finneytown hasn't provided uniforms in 14 years. Cheerleaders should receive the same respect as other Finneytown athletes. Cheerleaders are last on the list for gym time. Last year it cost parents \$600 to put a cheerleader on the field. Cheerleaders support our student athletes, why don't we support them?

### **Board Coordination Matters**

#### **Ms. Johnson, discussed the following items:**

- Finneytown Music Parents Association – was to meet tonight but did not.
- Finneytown Schools Educational Foundation – next meeting is this Wednesday.
- Safety & Security Committee – met last week
  - Brent Elementary – Concerns expressed about outside community use of school property (particularly tennis courts) during the school day and the possible risk to students. Modular units will be removed this summer.
  - Whitaker Elementary – Concerns expressed about outside community (Warder traffic) spilling onto school grounds. A barrier fence may be needed between these two properties.
  - Secondary Campus – Discussed repair of gym roof and a recently developed protocol being used by secretaries for unannounced school visitors.

#### **Mrs. Rebman, discussed the following items:**

- Finneytown Civic Association – Highlights included:
  - An update from Mrs. Noe on the school district's proposed Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) project.
  - A guest speaker on a solar panel initiative that is available to Springfield Township residents. A 30% tax credit is available this year, which will decrease in subsequent years.
- Finneytown Athletic Association – the meeting planned for last night was rescheduled for this coming Sunday.
- Art on Display – Landscape paintings created by Ms. Ficke's high school drawing and painting class. This is a culminating assignment for the painting unit in this course.

#### **Mr. Engleman, discussed the following items:**

- Facilities Committee – The committee met on May 8<sup>th</sup>. It is determining a step-by-step planning calendar, from now through the November election. A special board meeting will take place on Saturday to discuss next steps.
- Personnel Committee – did not meet.
- Finance Committee – did not meet.

- Secondary PTA
  - Approved a slate of officers for next year.
  - AfterProm took place and was very successful.
  - Not meeting this month and going into summer mode in June.
- Finneytown Boosters Association – met on April 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Still waiting for a Springfield Township permit to complete installation of the baseball and softball scoreboards.
  - Planning for the Greek Festival and coordinating activities with Whitaker Elementary continues.
  - In final stages of electing officers for next year, which should take place at the next meeting.
  - Awarded annual student scholarships.

**Mr. Stuhlreyer, discussed the following items:**

- Finneytown Elementary PTA – did not attend.
- Safety Committee Meeting – did not attend.
- Springfield Township Board of Trustees – attended
  - No action taken directly affecting the school district.
  - The repair on Winton Road in front of the YMCA and the Winton Woods bridge are on target for completion at the end of the year.
- Facilities Committee – Mr. Engleman has already provided an update.
- Legislative Liaison – The state house passed the biennial budget bill. It now moves on to the Senate.

**Mr. Gast, discussed the following items:**

- Missed some meetings due to out-of-town travel.
- Secondary PTA – Attended last month's meeting. Highlights included AfterProm preparations, and a presentation by Secondary Assistant Principal Anton Walker on discipline procedures and the work done with teachers and students to holistically approach behavior improvement. This is no doubt another significantly contributing factor in the reduction in student discipline referrals seen so far this year.
